W-50C Parksite

Public Workshop #1 – November 29, 6:30 pm

Approximately 20 residents attended in addition to City Staff

- The park development process was reviewed. The process is an average two year process from public outreach, design and construction. The first year includes public outreach, master plan design and construction document preparation. Construction occurs the second year. Tonight kicks off the start of the process with a target of construction beginning Spring 2021.
- The plan contained in the specific plan is a schematic concept only. It is considered as a “space planning” exercise to determine feasibility of the park layout, whether valued recreational amenities can be adequately accommodated and to determine a construction budget. The schematic drawing outlines more of an adult recreation space.
- The budget for construction of this parksite is approximately \$1,000,000.
- A follow up meeting will be scheduled to review a preliminary sketch. This meeting will start the beginning of a two-week write in period – a period where residents are encouraged to write in with feedback, comments and/or concerns regarding the preliminary sketch.
- Feedback was collected regarding desired amenities to be included in the park plan. Attendees were given three dots to mark their top three priorities or amenities for the park. The list below summarizes the amenities that residents expressed interest in having in the park.
