## CITY OF ROSEVILLE DRY CREEK WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT PLACER COUNTY

The City of Roseville (Discharger) owns and operates the Dry Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant (Facility), a publically owned treatment works located at 1800 Booth Road, Roseville, California. The Facility provides sewerage service for the southeast portion of the City of Roseville and portions of Placer County and the South Placer Municipal Utility District, and serves a population of approximately 111,000. The Facility provides tertiary level treatment for up to 18 million gallons per day. Treated wastewater from the Facility is discharged to Dry Creek, which flows to Natomas East Main Drainage Canal, and is ultimately discharged to Sacramento River, a water of the United States.

Discharges from the Facility are currently regulated by Waste Discharge Requirements Order R5-2008-0077-01, issued by the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) on 31 May 2013. An Order is proposed to renew the NPDES permit.

Only designated parties will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. All other persons wishing to testify or provide comments are interested persons and not designated parties. Such interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m.** on **17 February 2014**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is directly affected by the discharge.

Persons wishing to comment on this noticed hearing item shall submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m.** on

17 February 2014. Written materials or comments, including emails, submitted after 5:00 p.m. on 17 February 2014 will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record absent a ruling by the Chair. Any person requesting to submit late materials must demonstrate good cause for the late submission, and the Chair must find that accepting the late submission will not prejudice the Central Valley Water Board or any Designated Party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair.
