Planning and Redevelopment department staff applied for a grant from SACOG for the Downtown Specific Plan. SACOG awarded the City Redevelopment Agency a \$110,000 grant. The grant funds will be used for public outreach and will implement Blueprint strategies!

Additionally, the department has received an award from Cal American Planning Association (APA) on the Riverside Gateway Specific Plan. On September 21, the City of Roseville Planning and Redevelopment Department was presented the "Award of Merit for a Local Visioning Project".

## Civic Plaza Update

During the next twelve weeks focus remains on forming and pouring of the remaining decks. The process includes hanging the primary beams, laying-down the decks, constructing the edge forms, laying rebar, electrical conduit, and tensioning cables. After the deck is poured, and the concrete reaches a specified compression strength (2500 p.s.i), the tensioning cables are stretched. This provides additional strength and stability to the deck. After the deck is tensioned, the beam and deck forms are lowered and moved to the next section of the garage and the process begins again.

## **Historic District**

Construction is now underway. The boring contractor is working on three underground bores needed for the under-grounding of the overhead utilities in the District. Since the Historic District is so old, the majority of the underground utilities do not have plans that show where the utilities are. Subsequently, digging and trenching is a very slow process. Nevertheless, progress is being made.

City staff and merchants will continue to work together to minimize the challenges and lessen the impact of construction on businesses.
