REQUIREMENTS:

1. Maximum of 6 trees per residence.
2. Valid for purchases from **July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014** or until funds are depleted.
3. All applications must be postmarked no later than **60 days after purchase**.
4. Offer only valid for the purchase of trees from the list on reverse side. Some trees are rebated at \$25.00 and some at \$50.00 each.
5. All trees must be planted at a single-family residence receiving electricity from Roseville Electric and must be purchased new at retail price.

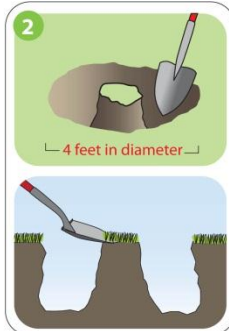

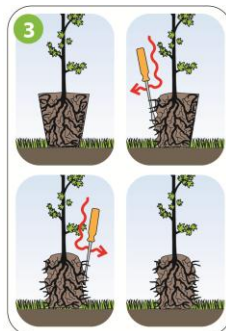

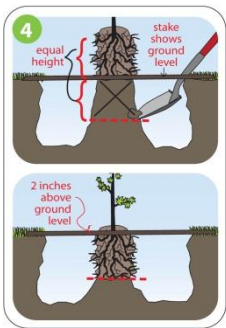
Before digging, where there normally might be underground utilities; (typically in front yards) make a toll-free call to Underground Service Alert (USA). Within 2 working days utilities locations will be identified and you will be cleared to dig. *USA service at no charge



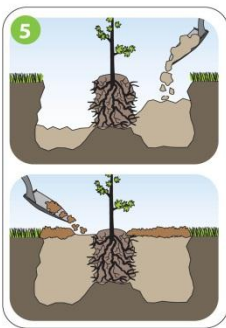
Dig a wide hole leaving the center as a pedestal. The pedestal will be shortened when you plant the tree. It gives the tree a stable platform. The surrounding "moat" helps distribute water around the tree and helps the roots grow down.



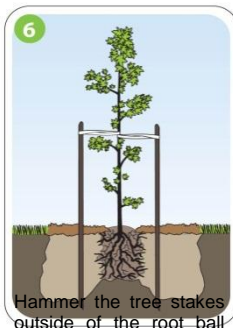
Remove the tree from the container. Spread the roots out so they are pointing outward, not circling around. Circling roots do not provide adequate support for a growing tree. You can cut larger circling roots with pruning shears or a sharp knife.



Put tree on pedestal using the stake for a guide; shorten the pedestal until the top of the root ball sits about 2 inches above the ground.



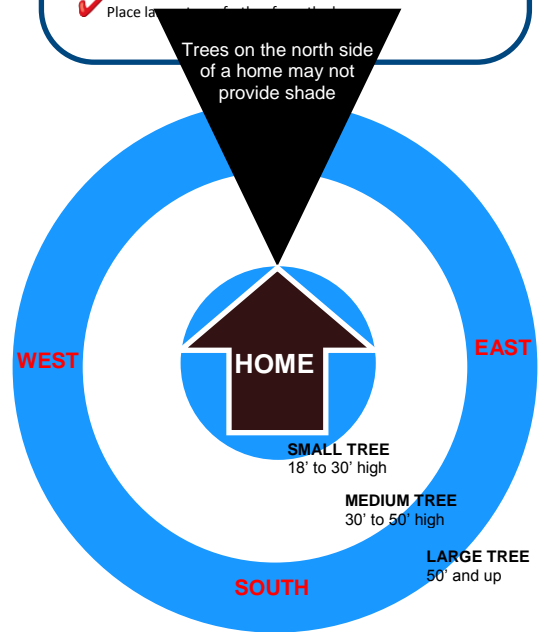
Fill the hole with the same soil you removed from the hole. If desired, thoroughly mix in up to 15 percent of compost of planting mix. Cover the soil with 3 to 4 inches of mulch, being careful not to cover the root ball.



Hammer the tree stakes outside of the root ball and away from the branches. Remove the stake that is tied directly to the trunk. Tie the tree to the stakes, leaving room for the tree to sway. It may require two sets of ties to keep the trunk vertical.

General Recommendations for Tree Placement

- ✓ Trees on the east side of the home provide morning shade
- ✓ Narrow trees may be placed closer to the home
- ✓ Do not block your or your neighbor's solar system
- ✓ Shade your Air Conditioner
- ✓ Place small trees in small spaces
- ✓ Place large trees in large spaces
