WATER CONSERVATION INFORMATION

We're experiencing unprecedented drought conditions. Folsom Lake, Roseville's primary water supply, has been at record low levels for this time of year and we do not see it getting better soon. Because of that, we all need to do our part to conserve water. The City of Roseville has activated an increased drought stage requiring customers to reduce water use by 20 percent. Read more to find out how this will affect you and ways to conserve!

Folsom Lake looks low. How bad is it and what does it mean for customers?

Folsom Lake has reached critically low levels this year and that means City of Roseville water customers need to conserve water. We're requiring our residential and commercial customers to conserve water by 20 percent. Commercial landscape customers are required to reduce their water use by 30 percent. It's easier than you think! Here are helpful tips to get you started on the road to reduction:

- 1. Reduce your outdoor irrigation!** Outdoor water use accounts for about 60 percent of a household's total use.
- 2. Check for leaks!** Leaky pipes, faucets and sprinklers can waste hundreds of gallons a month.
- 3. Know your use.** Households can track their water use at Roseville.WaterInsight.com and see how to reach a 20 percent reduction!

Will water quality be impacted by the water levels?

The water temperature will increase in Folsom Lake naturally because there is less water in the lake and we are experiencing warmer than average weather. Warmer lake temperatures can mean warmer water delivered to you which may slightly alter the taste. No need to worry, the high quality of the water is the same.

INDOORS



FILL BATHTUB 1/2 WAY OR LESS

SAVES 12 GALLONS
a bath




FIX A LEAKY FAUCET

SAVES 15-20 GALLONS
a day



REDUCE SHOWER TIMES FROM 10 TO 5 MINUTES

SAVES 12.5 GALLONS
per person/day




TURN OFF THE WATER WHILE BRUSHING TEETH

SAVES 10 GALLONS
a day



FIX A LEAKY TOILET

SAVES 30-50 GALLONS
a day



WASH ONLY FULL LOADS OF LAUNDRY

SAVES 15-45 GALLONS
per load

OUTDOORS



USE A BROOM INSTEAD OF A HOSE TO CLEAN HARDSCAPES

SAVES 8-18 GALLONS
a minute



QUICKLY REPAIR LEAKS AND BROKEN SPRINKLER HEADS

SAVES 20 GALLONS
a day



ELIMINATE 1 IRRIGATION CYCLE OR REDUCE EACH BY 2 MINUTES

SAVES 2,240 GALLONS
a month



WATER YOUR LANDSCAPE IN THE EARLY MORNING OR LATE AT NIGHT

SAVES 25 GALLONS
per cycle



INSTALL DRIP IRRIGATION FOR TREES, SHRUBS AND FLOWERS

SAVES 15 GALLONS
each time you water



ADD 2 TO 3 INCHES OF MULCH AROUND TREES AND PLANTS

SAVES 30 GALLONS
for every 1,000 sq. feet
