

## **City of Roseville Residential Irrigation Efficiency Rebate Terms and Conditions**

1. Any eligible irrigation equipment must be purchased and installed between July 1, 2019 and June 30, 2020.
2. Participants must be a City of Roseville water utility account holder. Utility account must be in good standing.
3. Customer must have a water meter installed and billed on a metered rate to be eligible.
4. Customer must have an existing automated irrigation system with an operable irrigation controller.
5. The applicant is solely responsible for complying with any and all laws, regulations, policies, conditions, covenants and restrictions that may apply and for any and all liabilities arising out of a conversion project. Applicants are encouraged to consult any applicable covenants, conditions and restrictions ("CC&Rs") or neighborhood Homeowner's Association ("HOA") regulations that may apply to an anticipated conversion project prior to submitting an application with the City.
6. The maximum rebate amount is \$100 per site. Rebates shall be given for water efficient product material only. Items such as couplings, wiring, electrical tape, etc. are excluded from rebate funding. Participants are eligible for one rebate per meter, per program year.
7. Applicant must complete project within 60 days of pre-inspection.
8. Customer must agree to a pre-inspection before any work is performed. If not submitted with application, customer must present City with irrigation improvement map (Attachment A) that include a detailed, itemized parts list and respective labor charges for all work to be performed and a sketch of current and proposed irrigation system during the pre-conversion site visit.
9. Eligible irrigation equipment includes equipment that improves irrigation efficiencies as determined by the City of Roseville efficiency staff. Program offers 100% equipment reimbursement and no labor reimbursement. Paid, itemized receipts and/or invoices are required. Efficiencies may include:
  - a. Matched precipitation rate sprinkler heads, pressure reducing devices or check valves: standardizing all make and models within systems.
  - b. Drip irrigation equipment: converting existing non-turf area spray equipment to low volume drip. Note: Microspray systems do not meet the terms of the program. Drip systems must be separated from overhead spray heads with an independent valve.
  - c. Convert standard spray type nozzles to low precipitation, high distribution uniformity or multi-stream nozzles with a precipitation rate of 1.15 inches per hour or less.
  - d. Pressure regulation equipment for irrigation system.
  - e. Rain shut off devices, switches or soil moisture sensors that completely shut off the irrigation timer in a measurable rain event. Does not include sensors designed specifically to upgrade an irrigation timer to a weather-based controller.
  - f. All newly installed equipment required to minimize runoff, overspray and meet City of Roseville requirements.
10. To operate efficiently system water pressure should fall within 25-55 psi or manufacturers recommended operating pressure range. Participants must modify their systems to meet the noted range for program eligibility.
11. Irrigation systems used must be equipped with a pressure regulator and filter located at the valve.
12. If a landscape contractor is used to make the irrigation improvements, the City recommends that the work be performed by a CA State licensed landscape contractor holding a C27, a D12 specialty license or a C36 plumbing license for pressure regulation equipment installation as well as a business license with the City of Roseville.
13. Customers who are actively participating in the Cash for Grass Program cannot receive funding from this program in the Cash for Grass project area. Areas outside of the Cash for Grass retrofit area are eligible. Participants are eligible to participate in the Weather-based Irrigation Controller Rebate Program.
14. The equipment installed must remain in compliance with all terms and conditions for a period of five (5) years following receipt of the rebate.
15. Rebate program is subject to available funding. Rebates will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis until funding is depleted. Submission of an application does not guarantee a rebate.
16. City reserves the right to modify or cancel the program at any time.
17. The program is designed to rebate a portion of the costs of irrigation upgrades and to encourage good water management.
18. I irrevocably authorize the City of Roseville, or anyone authorized/designated by the City, to use or reproduce any and all photographs which have been taken of my landscape as part of the Irrigation Efficiency Rebate Program by the City or the City's authorized agent(s) for any purpose determined by the City without compensation or further notice to me.
19. Cost per unit must not exceed manufacturer's suggested retail price (MSRP).
