Where can I get adult sports information?

The adult sports office located at the Maidu Community Center at 1550 Maidu Drive. For personal assistance in detailed inquiries, visit the adult sports staff between 8am to 6pm Monday through Friday. In addition, the Roseville Sports Center at 1545 Pleasant Grove Boulevard keeps updated program quides, team rosters and schedules and much more.

How can an individual player get on a team?

The Interested Players List is kept current at the Roseville Sports Center and Maidu Community Center and is made available at every adult sports registration date and team managers meetings. Managers who are looking for players, can access this list by coming in to the Roseville Sports Center or Maidu Community Center. The other option is for interested players to attend the games of the desired night or level of play during the first two weeks of league play. Often teams are short-handed and can use extra players to fill out their rosters. We currently do not register or place individuals on teams.

What do teams need to have at the time of registration?

You will need to have payment in full. If you are a resident team that wants to receive the resident team discount for the league for which you are registering for, you will need to provide proofs of residency for 70% of the players on your roster.

Cash, Check, Money Order, Master Card and Visa accepted.

What are the park rules for league play?

In general, alcohol, glass, sunflower seeds and animals are not allowed in the parks where we play adult sports.

How can you make sure your team gets in a league next season?

Returning teams up to one (1) year and in good standing get priority registration with a \$50 advanced registration deposit that "holds" your spot. Managers receive notice for deposit requirements & deadlines at the field/gymnasium or by mail at least one month prior to registration.

How can a team get a discounted league fee?

A resident is a person who lives in the City of Roseville. A resident team is a team that has 70% of their team residing in Roseville. To take advantage of the 15% resident team discount, show proofs of residency for each resident player at the time of registration. A proof of residency can be either a photocopy of the player's driver's license that has a Roseville address on it, or a photocopy of a City of Roseville Utility bill with the player's name on it.

A second opportunity exists for the Roseville Business Sponsored Team (R.B.S.T.) If your team is sponsored by a business in Roseville, you are eligible to receive 15% off league fees by having the sponsoring business pay the league fees with a business check or credit card.

Where do players get first aid during a game?

Those suffering from minor injuries: contusions, sprains, strains and abrasions can receive first aid from the scorekeepers or facility supervisor who have been trained in basic first aid. All sports venues have basic first aid supplies including ice packs which are kept in stock at all times in the sports kit. The procedure for receiving first aid includes that some basic information needs to be left with the scorekeeper in charge to document the use of supplies.

Where do we get our officials? or, "This looks like fun, how do I get a job here?"

The City of Roseville contracts for officials with three associations, Sunrise Officials Association, Sacramento Metro Officials Association & Capital West Officials Associations for softball, baseball and basketball respectively.

Concerns or compliments can be forwarded to the head of officials through our office at the Maidu Community Center. Formal written correspondences are the best tool for getting your voice heard. Please take advantage of our open communication policy. We look forward to your input, with the feedback provided we not only grow and improve our programs continuously, but also tailor the programs to meet the needs of the participants.

For the football, soccer, and volleyball programs the department hires and trains employees to officiate league play according to our league rules. As for other duties, the City of Roseville's Adult Sports Division is always looking for responsible, dedicated, hard-working individuals wanting to supplement their income with seasonal part-time employment.
