Industry Groups Applaud RE

For Reliability, Safety and Community Service

Roseville Electric is delighted to receive two awards from respected industry associations.

In April, the American Public Power Association (APPA) announced Roseville Electric was one of 64 utilities chosen to receive its Reliable Public Power ProviderTM or RP3 award. The APPA selected the utilities from more than 2,000 public power providers across the nation, each demonstrating proficiency in four key disciplines: reliability, safety, training and system improvement.

Within the four categories, each utility met criteria based on sound business practices and a utility-wide commitment to safe, reliable electricity. The APPA is a national organization representing more than 2,000 not-for-profit, community- and stateowned electric utilities.

New rate-assistance program earns kudos

This spring, Roseville Electric also received the California Municipal Utility Association (CMUA) 2006 Community Service/ Resource Efficiency Award for the city's new Utility Rate Assistance Program (URAP). This was Roseville's fourth CMUA award in five years. The

URAP was chosen by CMUA judges: State Senators Robert Dutton and Martha Escutia, Assemblyman John Laird, and California Urban Water Conservation Executive Director Mary Ann Dickinson for showing "innovative and comprehensive approaches to community service/resource efficiency."

The award-winning URAP plan was developed by city employees as a solution to the confusing process customers faced when seeking lowincome benefits for the city's electricity, water, sewer and garbage services. With a single-minded focus on making utility rate assistance as easy and accessible as possible, employees from Roseville Electric and the city's Environmental Utilities, Community Services and Finance departments formed an interdepartmental, multi-disciplined committee to resolve the issue.

The resulting URAP now offers customers a simple, "one-stopshop" rate-assistance program that is informative, clear and comprehensive.

Extreme summer heat is hard on young shade trees. As the temperature rises, make sure your young trees (especially newly planted ones) get plenty to drink in a way that ensures strong and healthy root systems. To help your trees beat the heat:

- 1. Place wood chips over the tree's roots, but not touching the trunk, to help hold moisture in the soil.
- 2. When temperatures are 90 degrees or below, water trees about twice a week, increasing to three times a week when the mercury hits 100 degrees, always being sure to let the soil dry out between waterings as trees grow poorly in wet or muddy soil.
- 3. Water deeply with a soaker hose or by letting water drip into the root zone for several hours. Short, frequent waterings usually do not soak in deep enough and encourage surface roots.
